And so we pray:

Holy One, may all that we offer, time, skill, and yes, even money, be used to transform lives and to transform this world into something that more closely resembles your greatest hopes and dreams for it. May all that we offer be a blessing to those we love, and to those we find unlovable. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
