How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge? ²³ Give heed to my reproof; I will pour out my thoughts to you; I will make my words known to you. ²⁴ Because I have called and you refused, have stretched out my hand and no one heeded, ²⁵ and because you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof, ²⁶ I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when panic strikes you, ²⁷ when panic strikes you like a storm, and your calamity comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you.

²⁸ Then they will call upon me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently, but will not find me.
²⁹ Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD,
³⁰ would have none of my counsel, and despised all my reproof,
³¹ therefore they shall eat the fruit of their way and be sated with their own devices.
³² For waywardness kills the simple, and the complacency of fools destroys them;
³³ but those who listen to me will be secure and will live at ease, without dread of disaster."
