MINUTE FOR MISSION:

W.W.J.D.? HERE'S ONE OF THE CHURCH'S BEST ANSWERS.

The question "What would Jesus do?" often shortened to the acronym "W.W.J.D." has graced wrist bands, T-shirts, and bumper stickers since the 1990s. And while it might sound like an overused cliché, it's a question that can lead our spirit and, by extension, our lives to profound transformation.

What did Jesus do? He crossed a lot of boundaries. In fact, when we think about the boundaries that separate people—things like money, gender, education, culture, religion, and class—Jesus crossed them all.

He struck up a conversation with a Samaritan woman in a culture where it wasn't socially acceptable for men and women, much less Jews and Samaritans, to speak to one another. He healed the bodies and souls of people suffering from a variety of diseases when it was sinful to have anything to do with them. He visited the homes of tax collectors and sex trade workers and advocated for the rights of widows, orphans, and those living in poverty. He not only valued children in a time when they were considered such drains on society that they were abandoned on roadsides,

but he also told his followers that unless they were more like children they wouldn't enter the kingdom of heaven.

In the same way, our generosity through Mission & Service breaks down walls that divide and builds bridges that draw us together.

Your generosity supports organizations like hospitals, counselling centres, drop-in circles, and homeless shelters that are there when people need them most. Your gifts sustain education programs that teach farming skills, provide job training, and help remove obstacles so children can remain in school. TIME FOR THE YOUNG AND YOUNG-AT-HEART

Jesus' disciples noticed that Jesus prayed a lot. He thanked God for food and for help—sometimes before he even got the help. He prayed all alone and in the middle of a group. Jesus' disciples asked him to teach them to pray. He

gave the disciples a prayer we call "The Lord's Prayer". Today we are looking at Luke's version, which is shorter than Matthew's—Matthew's is the one we know. But we can still learn a lot from Luke.

When you pray, what do you call God? I usually start off my prayers saying, "Loving God" because I know that God loves me and everyone so much The first thing we see is that Jesus calls God "Father". We can, too. It means we are God's very own children and we can talk to God just like we can talk to our dad or mom. We don't need to use big words. Just talk with God. Any name we use is fine, but Jesus wants us to remember that God is as close to us as a dad or mom or someone else who loves us a lot.

Then Jesus does not tell us to pray for what we need. Jesus says to pray that God's kingdom will come to pass. That means that time when everyone will follow God. When that happens, there will be peace, all people will be friends, we will all know God's love, we will love the planet God made. We need to practice living that way now, being peacemakers, friends, forgiving people. Now that is something worth praying for!

Next Jesus tells us how we are to pray for ourselves. "Give us day by day our daily bread." Jesus does not mean we should just pray for bread and maybe peanut butter! He means we can pray for the things we need in order to live as God wants us to live – like water to drink or a house to live in. We trust God to provide those things every day.

And then we pray for how we treat others. "Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us." It is hard, but we have to work at forgiving people who have been mean to us. That does <u>not</u> mean it is ok that they hurt us. It is never ok. It does not mean that we have to let them keep on being mean to us. We may have to get away from them if they won't stop. We may have to tell an adult or have an adult help us talk to them. But to forgive means we need to ask God to take the anger out of our hearts.

"And lead us not into temptation. This sentence means that we don't want to have things happen to us that might make us stop loving God. If we take something that is not ours, or hit our brother, is that a loving thing to do? Of course not! Everyone has hard things happen. Even when our brother or sister make us so mad we want to hit them, we can ask God to help us through those things and to trust God when things are difficult.

Just like you talk to your friends at school, or people at home many times a day, God is always there for you to talk with as well. I just love the piece Irene and Donna sang this morning, "How long has it been, how long has it been since you talked to the Lord?". God wants to hear from you. I hope you will talk to God every day!

Let's pray ..

Thank you, God, for giving us the words to pray, and for always being there for us. Thank you for sending Jesus to be our friend and showing us how to live and love. Hear us now as we pray the words he taught, saying, "Our Father ... Amen."

A READING FROM OUR FAITH TRADITION

Luke 11:1-13

He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.'

And he said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, "Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him." And he answers

from within, "Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything." I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

'So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to= those who ask him!'
